Sub-themes

The following sub-themes represent areas of focus from which the programme will be structured. They encompass a broad interpretation of the subject areas which will be delivered with examples including but not restricted to:

■ Athlete Welfare

Issues related to athlete welfare including: the social, cultural, pastoral, educational, ethical, psychological, psychiatric or biomedical aspects of wellbeing and support for athletes; the behavioural and relational parameters of critical relationships in sport (athlete/coach, athlete/parent, athlete/athlete etc.); the particular eligibility and developmental dilemmas associated with elite status; and policies and systems for harm prevention.

■ Eligibility and Inclusion

Issues related to the structures and organisation of sport for all from grass-roots to elite level including: age and weight categories, assumptions of gender binaries, disability classification systems, professional/amateur distinctions, social class boundaries, national identity criteria, competition rules, cultural values, and specifications for social inclusion programmes. Consideration will be given to the consequences of these criteria for sports participation and competition, training programmes, diet, technologies, funding, social exclusion, identity politics and athlete wellbeing.

■ Elite Performance

Issues related to elite sport performance including; the identification, training, coaching and management of talent; performance enhancement through technologies including legal and illegal performance enhancing aids, and injury prevention, treatment and rehabilitation and the science of doping. The influence of gender, religious, racial, cultural and class differences are considered in the context of elite performance.

■ Faith and Sport

Issues related to the interface between sport and exercise, and spirituality and religion including: the role of faith in sport and physical activity; faith work in sporting communities; sport, health care and wellbeing; local sports ministry; chaplaincy and the welfare of elite athletes; and the role of pilgrimages.

■ Governance and Policy

Issues related to the ways in which sport at a local, national, regional and international level is organised and managed, systematic procedures for evaluating policy alternatives, decision making, how policy directs, redirects or constrains social, political and economical behaviour. The power and authority in sports organisation including: structures, mission, vision, membership, elections and policy making.

■ International Sports Development and Management

Issues related to the role of sport and management practices in different cultural and international contexts. To be considered is the link between sport and child/youth development, peace building, disaster-response, disability, health, gender and economic development; factors affecting the management of health, fitness and sport programmes and organisations in the public, voluntary and commercial sectors including strategic and operational management, marketing and evaluation.

■ Major Sporting Events

Issues related to the social, political, economic, marketing, environmental and organisational aspects of major sporting events. The planning, delivery, governance, legacies and research of major events in the context of urban regeneration, city marketing, delivering wider social and political agendas, sports development and the global-local nexus. Issues related to sport and commercialization in sport-media-business relationships. Sport as a consumer product including: merchandising, media, advertising, corporate sponsorship; sports agents and the control of players; sport business.

■ Pedagogy

Issues related to the study of the teaching and coaching process focussed on physical education, games and sport in the education system. Examination of quality physical education across the life-span around the world related to time allocation in the syllabus, facilities, teachers training, safe environments and the impact of gender, faith, race, culture and class differences.

■ Physical Activity and Health

Issues related to the prevention of disease and the promotion of wellbeing through increasing levels of physical activity and decreasing sedentary time. Specific physical activity issues including the treatment of medical conditions; epidemiology; public health issues; inequality issues; measurement issues; the use of technology; lifespan considerations in the promotion of physical activity. The influence of gender, religious, racial, cultural and class differences.

■ Sports Medicine and Injury Prevention

Issues related to the development, provision and outcome of sports medicine in the elite and non-elite sporting arena including training and competition, with special interest in injury prevention, treatment and rehabilitation.

Delegates are invited to submit abstracts for either an oral and/or poster presentation. Submission opens on 1 July 2011 and your abstract must reach the Convention Secretariat on or before **1 November 2011**.

The preferred option is to submit your abstract via the Convention website (www.icsemis2012.com, open July 2011) where you will be guided through the process. If you are unable to make an online submission, please contact the Convention Secretariat for further information.

Abstracts will be limited to 2000 characters and 1 table (please note that different criteria will apply to invited session abstracts). All abstracts will be reviewed by the Scientific Committee. If requested by you, we will confirm via email that your abstract has been received. If you do not receive this email within 24 hours of submitting your abstract please contact the Convention Secretariat immediately.

Submitting authors will be informed whether their abstract has been accepted by end January 2012. Please note that all presenters of abstracts will be expected to register for the Convention by March 2012 (early bird registration deadline) or your abstract will be withdrawn. Abstracts will be listed on the British Library Website and will be published electronically for the Convention.

Consortium Universities

The Brunel Consortium was established to host ICSEMIS in Glasgow in 2012. The Brunel Consortium represents five universities across the UK. These are Brunel University, Liverpool John Moores University, University of Strathclyde, University of Ulster and the University of Wales Institute Cardiff.
